# **ARCHIPELAGO, 4.0** *Docu-Drawing, Activism, Re-Building*

## PART 1: Docu-drawing

September – November 2023

Assignment 1: Visual Essay: a short film (5-12 mins) presented and discussed in consecutive drafts, documenting your research about your site, with a distinct narrative structure, medium/genre, storyboards, found footage, drawings, models, interviews, intertext, voiceover, etc. It will help distill concepts, intentions, principles and the focus of your thesis. This project will be continuously developed throughout the Fall and during parts of the Winter term.

### PART 2: Activism (agent-building)

November – December 2023

Assignment 2: Composite Drawing-Models: you will transfer the research and documentation of your visual essay into different types of drawings and experimental models, documenting your site as well as specific spaces, artefacts, networks, fields and objects within it. These docudrawings and models will also be a part of the final version of Assignment 1: Visual Essay.

Assignment 3: Thesis Statement: in parallel with Assignment 1: Visual Essay, you will develop a 500-word text describing the research focus and potential projects of your Thesis. This text will be continuously developed throughout the Fall and Winter term. You may also define and describe an Agent, and your partnership with them.

### PART 3: Re-Building

January – February 2024

Assignment 4: Re-Building: you will be asked to draw and model a space or series of spaces that will be the main focus of your Thesis Project. You will immediately be asked to take these spaces apart, with the aim of re-drawing, re-modeling, re-building them.

## PART 4: Exhibition February – April 2024

Assignment 5: Exhibition: starting early, you will be asked to design the final exhibition of your Thesis project, including media and artefacts already developed in Assignments 1-5, significantly limiting the scope and production output of your extensive research and design arc into a few key deliverables that will present a concise and focused frame of your final Thesis Project..

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An optional Studio Trip to Greece will be scheduled as part of the course after the final review. It will include one or two field courses in Conservation, Activism, or Re-Building vs. different Crises, in collaboration with cultural/activist-run spaces in Athens, and the Archipelago Institute of Marine Conservation in the East Aegean.
